Our credit union was chartered on April 13, 1936 when seven members deposited \$5.00 each to provide employees of American Steel and Wire a safe place to save and borrow. We were originally named Joliet Wireco Federal Credit Union.

The name was changed in 1997 after several local credit unions merged with our credit union (Blue Flame Federal Credit Union and St Joseph Medical Center Federal Credit Union). Later two other credit unions (Moraine Valley Federal Credit Union and Heritage Corridor Credit Union).

Today we serve over 80 employee groups and 6600 members mostly located in Will and Cook counties. Our first office was built in 1967 on Collins Street in Joliet next to the American Steel and Wire office building. We now have four offices, two in Joliet on Collins Street and Springfield Avenue, one in Palos Heights and our newest office in New Lenox.
